PROJECT OPEN ARMS

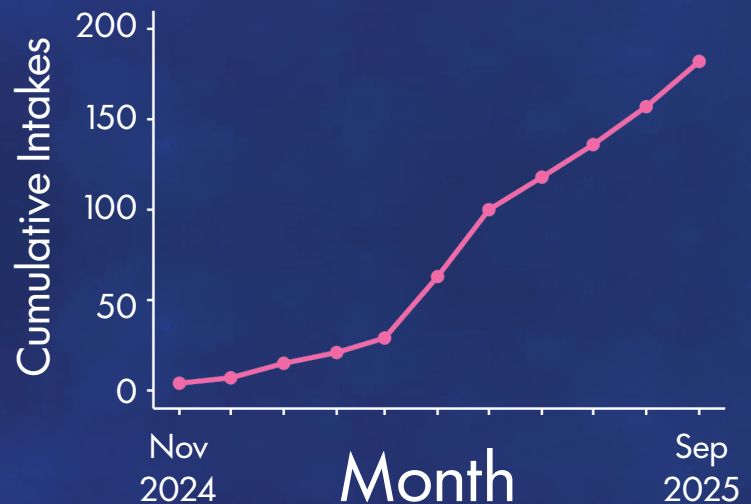


Project Open Arms is a grassroots resettlement project of TRACTION started in 2023 in response to the alarming increase in anti-trans legislation and rhetoric across the country. Many Two-Spirit, transgender, nonbinary, gender-diverse, and gender-nonconforming (trans+) people and their families are seeking to escape legislative persecution and violence. The Pacific Northwest has long been a destination for these “transplants”, and we expect an increase in the number of migrating people and families over the next decade.

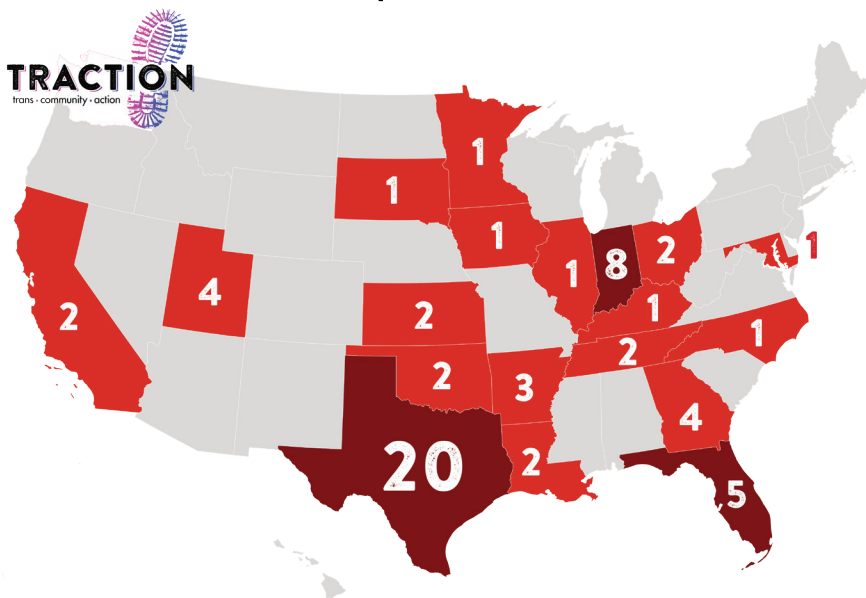
2024-2025 Impact:

- created a Washington Trans+ Relocation Guide
- helped **67+** transplants move to safer locations
- provided transportation financial assistance to **13**
- engaged **55+** volunteers
- provided **21** new arrivals with gender-affirming housing

Where transplants moved from



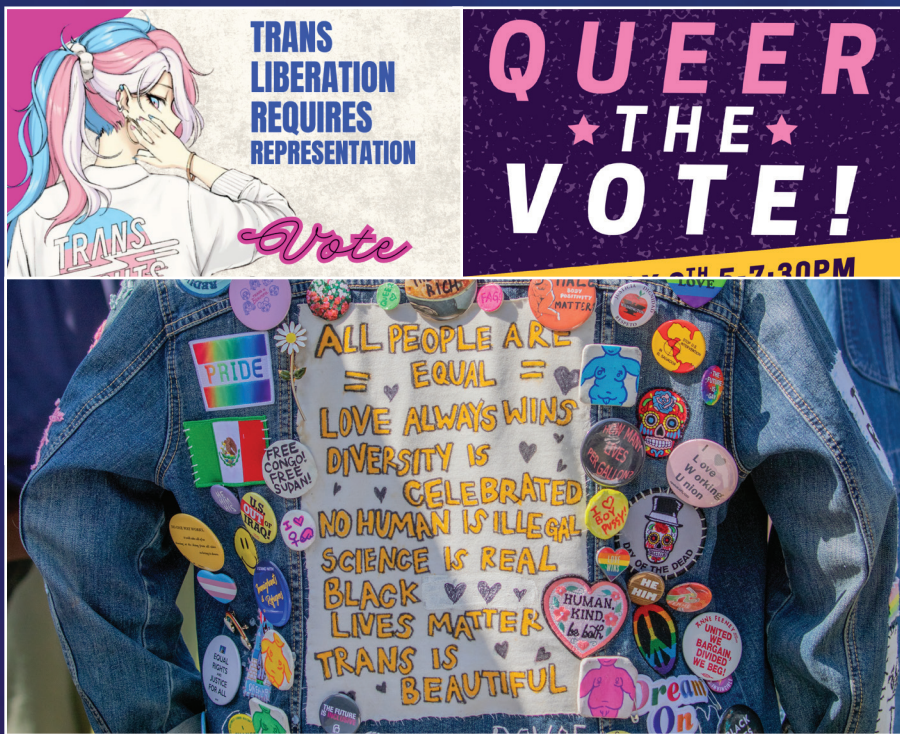
December 2024: Project Open Arms welcomes their first transplant at SEATAC airport.

FY24-25 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Trans Liberation NewsSource (TLN)

Our media programs document trans+ activism through a gender-diverse lens, with several ongoing projects:

- **Trans Heartbeat**, our video series showcasing trans+ leadership and allyship produced **5 episodes** and gained hundreds of new followers on YouTube.
- **Community Campfires**, our virtual education and discussion series addressing current events important to trans+ people.
- **TRACTION Action Comix & Reels**, our social media campaigns to dispel myths about trans+ folks and lives engaged over **17,000** people.



The **Vote 4 Trans Liberation** team collaborated on **4 events** to help Queer the Vote, hosted a rally at Cal Anderson Park, and sent **200+** postcards to swing-state voters.

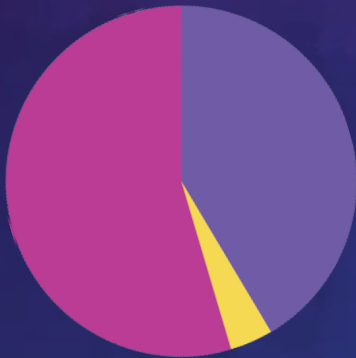
